**ESTABLISHMENT OF THE MOHAMMED BAZZI, M.D. MEMORIAL ENDOWED
STUDENT FUND**

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors establish the Mohammed Bazzi, M.D. Memorial Endowed Student Fund.

This fund is being established to encourage the pursuit of academic achievement in the postgraduate medical training program. The prize will be awarded to a resident in the Department of Internal Medicine who has authored the most scholarly project during the preceding year of training.

Background

Dr. Bazzi was born in Lebanon and received his medical degree from the University of Cairo School of Medicine in 1969. From 1975 through 1977 he served his last two years of residency at Wayne State University Affiliated Hospitals Program. Dr. Bazzi then completed a nephrology fellowship at Wayne State University in 1979.

In 1986 he joined the Department of Internal Medicine as a full-time assistant professor. As an active faculty member, Dr. Bazzi taught physical diagnosis, inpatient, and ambulatory medical care in addition to continuing to expand his research interests and clinical practice until his death in 1993. He became known to medical students, trainees, and colleagues as a highly skilled physician who was deeply concerned with the success of his pupils. Through his warmth and kindness he developed a highly supportive, educational environment that fostered learning. This memorial endowed student fund is created in memory of Dr. Mohammed Bazzi.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors establish the Dr. Guy J. Blackburn and Nathan G. Blackburn Endowed Memorial Scholarship.

This scholarship fund is established to recognize scholastic achievement, to encourage continued progress and to provide assistance to students in financing their education at Wayne State University.

Background

As a small child, until his untimely death, Nate lived life with energy, zest, love and a commitment to others. His love of creating and building drove him to become a structural engineer with a degree in civil engineering from Lawrence Technological University. He played a major role in constructing the massive roof of Ford Field and was site engineer for the removal and replacement of the huge destroyed furnace vents at the Ford River Rouge Plant. Without fanfare, he took a year out of his engineering career to teach math at Detroit Northwestern High School because of his determination to help others. This scholarship is a fitting memorial to a young man who left us with so much to remember and admire. It is a gift to the future of deserving students from Detroit Public Schools.

Guy was born in Whittier, California in a mountain area where he lived with his mom, Adeline, often-absent dad, Guy Sr., and four other siblings. Guy graduated from Arizona State University with a bachelor's degree in teaching, then a master's degree in history. After completing his Ph.D., he moved to Pontiac, Michigan and began working for Oakland Schools as a curriculum director in social studies. Following his retirement, when he was 62, he began a tutoring program at Wayne State University where college students traveled to elementary schools in the Detroit Public School System. Dr. Guy J. Blackburn was proud of his familial and professional legacy and would have considered this scholarship to be another piece of his life's mosaic.

Background

Fred Maynard grew up in Detroit and was a graduate of Western High School. After starting in the College of Pharmacy, his wife convinced him to transfer into the College of Medicine. They struggled financially living on her secretarial salary until his graduation in 1943. He was immediately drafted into the Army, but received a one-year deferment. He was sent overseas in December 1944 where he served in the Army Medic Corp. After being wounded and receiving the Purple Heart Medal, Fred returned home at the end of World War II to become a partner in a medical practice in Allen Park, MI. He remained there until his retirement in 1972, when he moved to Punta Gorda, Florida to play golf. Fred has two children. His daughter is a registered nurse and his son is a doctor specializing in physical medicine and rehabilitation. One of his grandsons became an Ophthalmologist. Ruth Maynard, his wife, was very active in recruiting young people for medical careers throughout her lifetime. They are honored to be able to help students pursuing a career in medicine.

SCIENCE PROGRAM ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP**

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors establish the Diane M. Rockall Library and Information Science Program Endowed Scholarship.

It is the intention of the donor to create the Diane M. Rockall Library and Information Science Program Endowed Scholarship with a gift of \$10,000, which has already been received by the university. In addition, the donor will annually contribute a gift of an undetermined amount. Of this annual gift, which will be accompanied by a letter to outline specific amounts and designations, \$1,000 will fund the Women of Wayne (account #444706) and a portion of this annual gift will be deposited into the Diane M. Rockall Library and Information Science Program Endowed Scholarship endowment account (account #060152) to grow the corpus. Any remaining funds will be distributed as stipulated in the donor's letter. Gifts from the donor began prior to the April 29, 2004 threshold change, therefore grandfathering this fund into the university at the \$10,000 level.

Diane M. Rockall establishes this fund to recognize scholastic achievement, to encourage continued progress and to provide assistance to students in financing their education in the Wayne State University Library and Information Science Program.

Diane M. Rockall has three degrees from Wayne State University, a Master's in History (1995), Master's in Library Science (1977) and a Bachelor's in Journalism (1970). Ms. Rockall has also received an honorary degree from Schoolcraft College in 1998.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE EDWARD WISE MEMORIAL ENDOWED SYMPOSIUM

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Governors establish the Edward Wise Memorial Endowed Symposium.

It is the intention of the donor to create the Edward Wise Memorial Endowed Symposium with a gift of \$25,000, which has already been received by the university, and an additional \$5,000 annually throughout her lifetime. The \$25,000 is currently held in the Wise-Cohn Endowment Fund, index 061048/fund 601719, and will be transferred to establish this new Edward Wise Memorial Endowed Symposium.

Background

The university and Professor Sandra VanBurkleo wish to establish the Edward Wise Memorial Endowed Symposium in memory of the late Professor Edward Wise, a renowned teacher and scholar of criminal law, comparative law and legal history at Wayne State University Law School, until his untimely death in 2000. The annual day-long symposium is created in support of the Law School, its students, its mission and its significance to the people of the state of Michigan.

Sandra F. VanBurkleo is associate professor of history and adjunct professor of law at Wayne State University and the author of "Belonging to the World": Women's Rights and American Constitutional Culture.
